When the king could not sleep one night, he summoned for the annals and he just so happened to hear of Mordecai's report that saved him. When the Jew's enemies had laid their plot to kill them all, Esther just so happened to be received by her husband, the king, which resulted in him granting the Jews the right to protect themselves from their enemies. God was not mentioned in this story, but that doesn't mean that God was not there.

"Give thanks," the psalmist cried. Tell everyone of the works of God! Praise Him, and seek the Lord! That is




#### RADA FOR OCC
